- Preparing amazing meals outdoors and enjoying a final celebratory banquet of delicious local foods, and awards ceremony on the final night








Location



We fly into Ivalo, a small town located 400km north of the Arctic Circle in Finland. Our beautiful and stunning location is set in the middle of a breath-taking national park near the borders of Russia and Norway. From May to September the landscape blooms. With its wild valleys, hills and forests, it is the perfect location to learn how to survive and thrive in the wild. Our second site in Finland is in Tornio and offers a similarly incredible experience.

We will camp outdoors in the most stunning locations for the majority of the expedition in tents or hammocks.

On the first and last nights we will stay in gorgeous log cabins with open fires.



When near base camp, we also have use of a superb lodge in which we will take some of our meals and prepare for each of our journeys. Whilst there, we also have use of hot showers, saunas, and a wonderful barbeque shack in which to relax, swap stories and socialise.



Expeditions take place between May and September
