## Location

This expedition is to the southern coast of Cornwall near Falmouth. It takes place along stunning cliffs and beaches, within the beautiful Helford river estuary and upstream into jungle-like tributaries that are lined with ancient oak woodlands. Here, the trees hang right over the water where our paddlers make their way with the tides. The seas are as clear and as blue as the Caribbean, rich in edible seaweeds, oysters, fish and juicy mussels. An ideal location for a coastal survival adventure! We even see occasional pods of dolphins.







## **Accommodation & Facilities**





Our base is at a fully serviced campsite from which daily excursions take place to the sea or river as students learn how to kayak and canoe. Overnight trips then take place on mini-expeditions that include overnight wild camping in tents or hammocks dependent upon location.

Pupils learn and practice survival and bushcraft skills and are responsible for all their food preparation and cooking. They will learn the importance of food hygiene, personal and camp organisation. Basic but wholesome supplies will be provided which will be added to from wild and natural resources foraged from the beaches and woods or caught in the sea.



## Itinerary



#### **Expeditions take place from March to September**

**Day 1** - Travel day, set up camp and equipment, and team meal

Day 2 - Safety briefing and kayaking lessons

Day 3 - River kayaking, survival skills and wild camp

Day 4 - Sea kayaking, bushcraft skills and celebratory meal

Day 5 - Travel home or Canadian canoeing/paddle boarding day

Day 6 - Travel day for extended trips
