

Expedition Highlights



The West coast of Scotland is a land of wonder and adventure that will capture the spirit of the Really Wild Explorer right from the start. Venturing out into a landscape that is overwhelmingly magnificent in its size and beauty will take your breath away.

The opportunity to get a taste of what it would have been like to travel through and live in the Scottish wilderness during ancient and pre-historic times is presented at every turn - with its mountains and lochs, free running rivers and a coastline that is rugged, full of resources and peppered with deserted and forested islands.

Activities

Activities can be tailored according to each group's requirements, age or experience but may include for example:

- Expedition planning and organisation getting ready to explore
- Trekking and navigating along post glacial lochs and rivers, and through forests
- Wild camping in tents, hammocks or wild shelters
- Coastal foraging and survival skills perhaps with the possibility of deserted island or beach survival challenges
- Practicing and developing bushcraft skills e.g. knifecraft, axe-craft, firecraft, campcraft, foraging, natural navigation, tracking and spotting wildlife e.g. magnificent stags, otters and eagles.
- Site seeing e.g. ancient castles and Harry Potter's railway (optional)
- Outdoor cooking and a brilliant awards dinner and celebration on the final evening





Location



Base camp is in Glenuig at the head of a beautiful coastal inlet which is situated thirty five miles from Fort William on the West coast of Scotland. It is one of the country's most stunning locations!

The inlet itself is surrounded by woods and diverse environments including pristine lochs and rivers, post-glacial valleys and deserted islands. This wild and historic place has all that is needed for a true adventure, thrills and self-discovery.

Accommodation & Facilities

Our explorers camp outdoors in tents, under tarps or in wild debris shelters dependent upon location or choice of itinerary. Some nights will be in or near to base camp with others out in the wilds removed from immediate civilisation.

Our site in Glenuig offers all the necessary facilities from which to base ourselves and prepare any excursion. It also has space indoors should weather become extreme.

Expeditions can take place all year round, with each itinerary suitably adapted for the weather and pupil capabilities
